- April 14, 2014. An <u>atmospheric field-sampling study</u> published in the Proceedings of
 the National Academy of Sciences demonstrates 100x to 1000x higher emissions

 estimates. This is a BIG climate issue. PSE Healthy Energy researchers, Tony
 Ingraffea and Renee Santoro are co-authors on the study. Here are some links to
